PTSA News

Dear NHS Parents and Guardians,

As the 2014/2015 school year comes to an end, the NHS PTSA board would like to thank all those who became members this year. Currently we have a total of 615 members (580 family/individual, 23 staff and 12 student memberships) and we have received recognition from the Connecticut PTSA for increasing membership by 10% this year. Thank you!

During the past three years, the PTSA has funded the following initiatives:

2012-2015 School Years:

- \$7,200 To support student assemblies
- \$7,200 Allocated towards staff grants
- \$3,500 Granted towards student scholarships
- \$3,000 To support Freshman Forum
- \$50 Granted to Junior/Senior projects
- \$225 Allocated to nurse's office for juice, water, etc.
- \$270 Allocated to the NICE library

In addition, each year we have provided:

- 1) A breakfast in September and an appreciation luncheon in May for 150 NHS staff members
- 2) Dinner for senior citizens in March
- 3) Bagels and water for all students during the multi-day CAPT testing in March
- 4) Pretzels for all students during the multi-day SBAC testing period in April/May.

It doesn't stop there – we supported many other programs and activities as they have come up throughout each year.

We appreciate your generosity since without your donations and volunteer hours none of these initiatives, grants or programs could be possible. We also thank our Principal, Lorrie Rodrigue, our PTSA Teacher representative, Karen Sherman, our three Assistant Principals, Kathy

Boettner, Jaime Rivera and David Roach, our Newsletter Editor, Evelyn Hufziger and the rest of the NHS staff for all of their support throughout the year.

Finally, a special word of thanks to my fellow dedicated board members: Rachelle Kahn, Vice President, Alpana Dholakia, Secretary, and Angela Thill, Treasurer, all of whom work many hours throughout the year to make sure your donations have the largest impact and our children are able to enjoy a better experience at Newtown High School. We look forward to your continued support and to even more of you becoming members next year!

Bringing Shakespeare to the 21st Century

After reading *The Tempest* by William Shakespeare, students in Jacob Thomas, Michelle Toby and Katie Knapp's junior classes created reality TV-based confessional videos for characters from the play. Groups of three to four students wrote, filmed, and edited multiple two-minute confessional videos showing how a character reacted to the events in the play. The confessionals, which required fidelity to the play and a deep and nuanced understanding of how one character evolves during the course of the play, allowed students to actively and independently make an in-depth character analysis through nontraditional media.

Climate Change

AP environmental students test various liquids to see which would be best to use in a thermal solar collector.





Senior Exit Survey 2015



Seniors: **It is important that the senior exit survey be filled out in NAVIANCE.** All you have to do is go to your home page in [Naviance](#) and click on the link which will take you to the survey below. The survey must be complete to ensure your final transcript is sent to the school you are attending in the fall. All outstanding transcript fees must be paid and your community service hours posted. Below is an example of what the survey looks like in Naviance.

- I. HOW MANY HOURS OF COMMUNITY SERVICE HAVE YOU PERFORMED WHILE AT NEWTOWN HIGH SCHOOL?** Please note that these hours must be listed on your resume in Naviance, as this will be checked to confirm all information. This is not a graduation requirement; however, those who have performed at least 150 hours of community service will receive a pin to wear at graduation to acknowledge this accomplishment. In order to record, go to "About Me" and click on "Resume" under "Interesting Things About Me" and enter information under "Volunteer Service" from the pull-down menu.

- 2. HAVE YOU PAID YOUR FEES FOR TRANSCRIPT REQUESTS FOR COLLEGE APPLICATIONS?** It is absolutely mandatory that all fees be paid by June 1; otherwise, notification will be submitted to the assistant principal's office which may affect the distribution of your graduation cap and gown. In order to verify the status of your account and the amount owed, go to Colleges; click on "transcripts" on the left, then to "View status of transcript request." Scroll to the bottom of the page. Please make all checks payable to "NHS - Guidance" and submit to Mrs. Korotash in the School Counseling Office.

- 3. IT IS MANDATORY TO COMPLETE THE FOLLOWING POST-SECONDARY INFORMATION PRIOR TO GRADUATION.** Please add all other information, i.e., name of college/university you will be attending; the specific branch of military, etc. The name of the college/university and all other post-secondary institutions **MUST** be entered, as this is where your final transcript will be sent. Also, please make certain that the status of all other applications is updated in Naviance. This can be done by going to "Colleges I am Applying To" and clicking on the pencil icon to get to the pull-down menu.

The Barton Weller Scholarship



This \$14000 scholarship is open to rising seniors (2016 graduates) at NHS as well as seniors at four other area schools. The scholarship is based on a five month original independent research project. The finalist is selected by a panel of judges from the Weller Foundation. You can pursue any topic, "...from art to behavioral science to computers to zithers - providing it involves original, independent study or creative endeavor." You have from now until the beginning of October to formulate a proposal. Five finalists will be selected from all proposals received from all area schools.

Internships

Internships are open to junior and senior students during the school year. Placements are selected based on the student interest. Positions may be paid or unpaid.



The internship experience is noted on the student's transcript once thirty hours are completed and the student submits a reflection on the internship experience. There is a regional medical internship program as well that provides internships in regional hospitals through Education Connection. Applications are available in the College/Career Center for both programs.

Junior/Senior Projects

The Junior and Senior Project class provides the motivated and responsible junior or senior learner an opportunity to develop a career-oriented relationship with a community professional in the student's area of chosen interest. Participants are expected to be motivated and self-directed. The program requires that the Junior/Senior Project be an experience unavailable in the traditional classroom.

Interested students should stop by the Career Center to pick up a packet and sign up for the course with their School Counselor. Students take this course for the “stand-out” factor in college applications/interviews and to apply for scholarships.
